

Georgia 4-H Service Project

Georgia 4-H'ers are some pretty amazing people! For 14 years 4-H members have participated in a service project to benefit Ronald McDonald Houses in Georgia. Ronald McDonald houses serve sick children and their families while they are away from home receiving medical treatment. 4-H'ers are asked to save the aluminum pull-tabs from canned drinks and food cans for this project. Over the past 14 years, 4-H'ers across Georgia have collected over 150,000 pounds of pop tabs contributing more than \$100,000 to the Ronald McDonald House Charity.

Snap the tab off and bring to your class to help with this project and earn points for your class at the same time. Be sure to recycle the rest of the can too!
