4-H Healthy Living Poster Contest

Did you know that students who participate in 4-H are 2 times more likely to report healthy living activities? Here's another opportunity to show your knowledge on being healthy and win a prize too. Draw a poster for the healthy living poster contest and help your class earn "club of the month" points. Create a poster using the theme "Healthy Living". Read and follow the contest rules listed below:

1. The poster must portray healthy choices people make in their daily lives.
2. No need to buy special poster paper, regular 8.5 x 11-inch paper is fine.
3. Use any artistic media (crayons, colored pencils, markers, etc.) that you choose as long as your poster is flat.
4. Complete and turn in your poster to your teacher no later than December 9th.
5. Be creative and have fun!

Posters will be judged on creativity, accuracy of information and visual appeal. Each poster will earn your class 25 points for club of the month competition. Winners will be announced in the January newsletter.

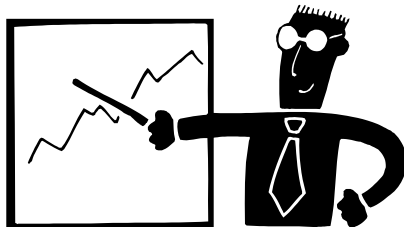
CPA is a Fun Learning Experience

You've had time to think about the October lesson on how to give a speech. Let's put those skills to work and enter the 4-H Project Achievement competition! Now is the time to check out the project listing and choose a subject in which you are interested. Project Achievement takes place on **Saturday, February 18, 2022, at Clarke Middle School from 9:30 AM until NOON.**

To participate in this competition students, present a 3–6-minute informative speech about their topic, using visuals such as posters or items to enhance their presentation. Unfortunately, in this 4-H competition we cannot use PowerPoint or similar computer-generated programs for these presentations. There are a few exceptions to the speech requirement that were outlined on your project list sheet. Students interested in the Food Labs Projects: Between Meal Snacks or Food Fare category must make an appointment with 4-H staff to learn about the special requirements for those projects. You and a parent will need to meet with 4-H staff before competing in either.

Students compete against other students who are presenting in the same category they have selected. Judges will listen to each presentation and award points in the following manner: **appearance, visual aids, delivery, orderly progress, accuracy of information, coverage of subject, knowledge of subject and time limit.** As a bonus, winners from the CPA competition in February will earn the opportunity to travel to Jackson County to compete in the District contest (DPA) on **March 25**.
