# Project Achievement - Part 2

## Writing the Speech & Visual Aids

### Parts of the Speech

**Introduction** - will get your audience interested in your speech. Some ways that you can make your speech interesting include <sup>1</sup>starting with a fun or shocking fact related to your topic, <sup>2</sup>having your audience imagine how they felt during a certain situation, or <sup>3</sup>starting with a question that you will answer with your presentation.

**Body** - 3 subtopics about your main topic

**Conclusion** - will help your audience remember your presentation. You will summarize what you have already said. Consider ending with a <sup>1</sup>call to action that asks your audience to take a stand about an issue that you discussed, a <sup>2</sup>challenge question that asks your audience what they might do differently now that they have heard your presentation, or <sup>3</sup>humor related to your topic.

**Evaluate/Communicate:** List 3 ways to introduce your topic and 3 ways to conclude your topic.
