#### **COUNTY IMPACT**

Over the last year UGA Extension Effingham County has provided many programs and services to the community around us. This can be seen from the over **25,000 men, women, and youth** that our office has helped or interacted with since November 2022.

#### **COUNTYWIDE EVENT**

Effingham County Extension/4-H has now hosted the second annual Boo-in-the-Park fundraiser. The fundraiser is a way to help youth and their families attend summer camps in 2024. Camp costs have risen drastically over the last two years. Rallying community partners and local businesses together, the Boo-in-the-Park fundraiser provides community members and their families a family friendly Halloween experience, featuring trick-r-treating, face painting, bounce houses, fresh food off the grill, and a movie in the park to end the evening.

#### 4-H PROGRAMMING

Provide monthly in-school educational We programs for all 5th grade students in county. We are also piloting 6th grade classes at Ebenezer Middle School this year with hopes of adding all 6th grade classes next year! We also offer opportunities for youth to participate in service learning projects (collect food for food pantries, collect pet food for animal shelter, collect pop tabs for the Ronald McDonald House, collect items and stuff stockings for Backpack Buddies, write thank you letters to first responders, and more!) that will benefit citizens in Effingham County. The local 4-H program has received numerous awards for achievement in Project Achievement, as well as for excellence in camping programs.

## AGRICULTURE AND NATURAL RESOURCES PROGRAMMING

Effingham County agricultural enterprises are estimated to have exceeded \$53 million. UGA Extension functions as a service not only to those entrepreneurs engaged in agriculture, but also to homeowners and industry throughout the county. On average Effingham County Extension works with individual county residents to distribute sound scientific recommendations to solve a broad array of issues involving wildlife, water, soil, crop production, and livestock production just to name a few. Over 600 soil, plant, and water samples are submitted through our office annually to help address those issues. Of all the industries represented in Effingham agriculture, forestry products comprise the most income flow, second only to row crops, followed by cattle and forages in third.

### BY THE NUMBERS

- 7929 individuals sought assistance from Effingham County Extension in the form of phone calls, face-to-face office visits, and emails
- 243 site visits were made upon request of clients with 68 issues or concerns diagnosed.
- 700+ samples were submitted to UGA Agriculture Laboratories
