Catoosa County 4-H worked with eight local elementary schools to allow students to participate in Project Achievement in their classrooms. Students were given instruction on how to write a research speech and how to present a demonstration in front of a classroom. They were given tips on good and bad posters and opportunities for after school help, as well as an opportunity to advance to a district-wide competition.

Catoosa County 4-H had over 550 students participate in the classroom with over 75 attending the District Project Achievement competition at Georgia Highlands College. These students participated in most of the 50 categories offered by Georgia 4-H, and Catoosa County had the highest number of participants out of 14 counties. **extension.uga.edu/Catoosa**


